PREFACE

The Fifth Population and Housing Census, initially due in March 1991, was conducted from 2-18 March 1998 throughout the country including Federally Administered Tribal Areas, Northern Areas and Azad Kashmir. During the first three days i.e., from 2nd to 4th March houselisting was carried out where in each house was physically numbered and registered as an inventory for conduct of the census from 5th to 18th March. The inventory served as a guideline for the supervisors besides ensuring complete coverage, during the census operation.

There were 3 separate questionnaires used for houselisting and collection of information on population and housing characteristics. Form-1 (Annex-A) was used for houselisting. Form-2 i.e., short form (Annex-B) was used for collection of information about all persons on core questions such as name, relationship with the head of the household, residential status, sex, age, marital status, nationality, religion, mother tongue, literacy, educational attainment and possession of national identity card, number of rooms, tenure, period when constructed, construction material of walls and roofs and source of drinking water-inside or outside, source of light, fuel used, type of kitchen, bathroom and toilet facilities and watching of TV and radio and reading of newspapers.

Form-2-A i.e., long form (Annex-C) was used for obtaining additional information about migration along with its reasons, field of education, economically active population, fertility, disability and inoculation of children against 5 diseases were asked on sample basis. About 8 percent single stage stratified sample was drawn with slightly more representation given to small provinces, districts and urban areas to make it a representative sample. Necessary definitions and concepts relating to the above mentioned questionnaires/forms are given at (Annex-D) for information of the readers.

The report mainly consists of three sections viz write up which carries general description of the district and some analysis of population and housing data, second section comprises tables while third section provides additional information about these sections in the form of annexures.

The write up section contains three main parts viz (i) general description about the district, (ii) broad analysis of population census data and (iii) broad analysis of housing census data. The general description covers location, boundary, area, geography, climate, rainfall, ethnicity, administrative set-up, agriculture, flora and fauna, health, industries, communication system, infra structure beside introducing the district. The broad analysis of population census data deal with population size, growth and distribution, other demographic and socio-economic characteristics.

The broad analysis of housing census data throw light on housing units/households, in terms of information on number of rooms, population density per housing unit and per room, tenure, period since constructed, construction material used on walls and roofs, source of drinking water, source of lighting, cooking fuel used in kitchen, availability of kitchen, toilet and bathroom facilities and assessment of media reach etc.

The report comprises 52 tables in all, 40 relate to population data, 12 to housing data. Of 52 tables 27 are based on complete count information while remaining on sample count information. Because of space problem the tables on occupation and industries are given in coded form. Therefore, after mentioning occupation and industries in coded form on the tables the detail occupational groups and industry divisions and district/sub-division map are appended at Annex-E. F & G respectively.

Census taking was a gigantic task which involved the whole nation in one way or the other which is commendable as a team work. The role of Provincial Governments was very vital and with out their active cooperation, the operation would not have been successful. The meritorious services rendered by the field staff in addition to their own jobs, are also appreciable. The services rendered by the staff and officers of Federal Bureau of Statistics in training and data processing was helpful. I am personally indebted to the Federal Government who inculcated in me a sense of responsibility to conduct the census in March 1998, and releasing the data as early as possible for the benefits of all users.

The Armed Forces supported the Population and Housing Census work on hundred percent basis therefore, I extend my gratitude to their officers/staff involved in this operation.

I also thank the International Agencies like UNFPA, UNDP, UNICEF for their financial assistance in acquiring equipment & machinery and technical support in the form of consultancy services, training and study visits abroad.

Finally I thank the officers and staff members of the Population Census Organization for their relentless efforts to complete the census successfully.

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PART - I GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

1. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

1.1 GEOGRAPHY

1.1.1 Name, Location, Boundary and Area

At the time of 1981 Census, Musakhel was a tehsil of the then, Loralai district. In January, 1992, Loralai district was divided into Loralai, Barkhan and Musakhel districts. Musakhel district derives its name from its headquarters town.

The district lies from 30° 13 to 31° 27′ north latitudes and from 69° 29′ to 70° 18′ east longitudes. It is bounded on the north by Zhob district and tribal area adjoining Dera Ismail Khan district, on the east by Dera Ghazi Khan district of the Punjab province and tribal area adjoining Dera Ismail Khan district, on the South by Barkhan and Loralai districts and on the west by Zhob district. The total area of the district is 5728 square kilometers.

1.1.2 Physical Features/Topography

The topography of the district is dominated by the mountains and hills of the Sulaiman range. The terrain is rugged and divided into basins by ranges from 900 to 3000 metres above sea level. The highest peak in the district is 3109 metres above sea level. There are a series of plains in between the parallel ranges. There are several other important ranges the Spara or Sohar range runs from north to south on the eastern border of the district. The Surghar range extends from north-east to south-west on the western border of the district.

The Torghar, Shinghar and Morga ranges are in the upper north. The Nathaghar and Lakhighar ranges are in the southern portion of the district. The Bujgar, Sputoghar, Dhaulighar and Galaisar are on the south-east. Land along Razanni river, from Palosi Punga in the north up to Musakhel town in the south, is a fertile plain. There are also several river valleys. The Ispangla valley is situated in the eastern portion of the district. Lime stone, shale and sand stone are the main types of rocks involved in the formation of the area.

1.1.3 Rivers and Streams

The main rivers and streams, which drains the Musakhel district, are Razanni, Loe Lahar, Lori Tang, Kingri and Sarin. The general flow of the rivers and streams is from west to east. During the monsoon these streams are flooded resulting in wide spread losses of livestock and property.

1.1.4 Climate

The climate of the district is hot in summer and cold lin winter. Summer starts in April and ends in October. June is the hottest month with mean maximum and minimum temperature of about 38°C and 24°C respectively. Winter months are from November to March. January is the coldest month with mean maximum and minimum temperature of about 16°C and 4°C respectively. the district lies outside the monsoon area, therefore, the rainfall is light.

The data on temperature and rainfall is not available for Musakhel. Therefore, the monthly 30 years mean maximum and minimum temperature, precipitation and relative humidity recorded at Barkhan station which is adjacent to Musakhel district is given in the following table 1.1:-

1.1.5 Flora

The climate of Musakhel is conducive for all types of flora. Wild plants are generally seen on the mountains and hillsides. Grass and fodder plants are fairly numerous in the district. The most important of these are barwaz, barara, barav, buski, ghalmae, ganderae, khar or zmai, lukha etc. Important trees growing in the district are palosa (acacia modesta), showan (olive), ghaz (tamarix orientalis), halanae, makhae (caragana), manri, angur (vitis vinifera), karkanra (zizyphus nummularia), ber (zizyphus jujuba), pastawana (grewia oppositifolia), wanna (pistacia cabulica), wulla (salix), tali (dalbergia sissoo) etc.

1.1.6 Fauna

The wild animals found in the district are striped hyena, Chilton markhor and Suleman markhor. Game birds are also found in the area.

1.2 AGRICULTURE AND RELATED SECTORS

1.2.1 Agriculture

Musakhel has fertile soil which consists of soft clay, but that of a hilly tract is mixed with gravel. Rabi crops (spring harvest) consist of wheat and barley. The Kharif crops (autumn harvest) consists of maize, jowar, moong, and bajra. Wheat in rabi and maize and moong in Kharif are the principal crops. Agricultural machinery used in the area includes tractor, thresher, and some tube wells operated by diesel engines. Acreage, production and yield of major rabi and kharif crops grown in the district for the year 1997-98 is as under in table 1.2;-

1.2.2 Irrigation

Twelve streams and seven springs with permanent flow irrigate 35 percent of the area. The remaining is *khushkaba* or *sailaba* (land depending upon rainfall). Other significant source of irrigation are tube-wells and open surface wells. Irrigation sources are scarce and there is a great need of small dams. Adequate fertile land is lying for want of water.

1.2.3 Forestry

The district is devoid of forests. The forest department has declared a small piece of land in Sarkandi area as reserved forest. There is neither state forest nor commercial forestry in the district. Organized afforestation is needed in the area, in order to check soil erosion from torrential rains. Many wild trees grow in the district which provide fruit, fuel-wood and timber to the people.

1.2.4 Horticulture

As the winter season is mild, some of the fruits of cold areas are produced in the district including apple, almond, apricot, grape and pomegranate. A major portion of the produce is consumed locally. The absence of a proper road network is a major hinderance in the marketing of fruits. Acreage, production and yield of major fruits grown in the district for the year 1997-98 is shown in the following table 1.3:

1.2.5 Livestock

Majority of the population is involved in livestock raising. The population engaged in agriculture also raise cattle and small ruminants to fulfil their milk and meat requirements. Livestock raising communities live throughout the district specially in the hillsides of Musakhel, Drug, Kingri and Toisar areas. There is enough pasture land in Musakhel. The veterinary treatment facilities are also rare. Livestock population of the district according to Livestock Census, 1996 is as under in table 1.4:-

1.3 INDUSTRY AND TRADE

1.3.1 Industry

There is no industrial unit in Musakhel and the commercial activities are limited due to the absence of infrastructure. Roads, electricity, credit facilities, skilled manpower and technical support are considered the prerequisite for enterprise development but these all are severely lacking in Musakhel.

1.3.2 Communication

Only Musakhel, town, is connected with other parts of the province and the country by black top as well as shingle roads, However, the load frequency of traffic is very low on these roads. Only 72 kilometres of the National Highway (N-70) passing through the Kingri

area of the district is metalled. All other roads are shingle and are in a very poor condition. Kingri to Musakhel road is now under construction by Rural Access Road Project. Other important road/tracks are Musakhel-Durg- Karkana road, 62 kilometres (2) Musakhel - Toisar road, 52 kilometres and (3) Musakhel to Morgha Kibzai road, 45 kilometres. These vital shingle roads are in dire of being black topped because development of any area cannot take place without roads.

The district has neither railway nor air link to other parts of the province or country.

The Pakistan Telecommunication Limited (PTCL) has established four exchanges in the district i.e. at Musakhel, Drug, Kingri and Rarasham. The digital telephone exchange is being established at Musakhel. Fax service is not available in the district.

The Pakistan Postal Services Corporation has established four post offices in the district i.e. at Musakhel, Drug, Kingri and Rarasham and some other localities. Delays in the delivery of mail is a common complaint due to poor transport system. No special or express courier service is available in the district.

The Kingri, sub-tehsil of Musakhel has a regular electricity supply but the remaining district including the headquarter is deprived of electricity. The generating unit at Musakhel often remains out of order. The poles erected from Kingri grid station to Musakhel town in 1996 have yet to be energized, for want of funds for wiring. Electricity is the most demanded facility both for lighting and tube wells to irrigate the fields.

The district does not have access to natural gas pipeline, nor there is any permanent agency for Liquified Petroleum Gas (LPG) in the district. Only some well-to-do families buy gas cylinders from Loralai or Dera Ghazi Khan.


Only some people have T.V sets and radio. There is no local radio station. Transmission from Multan and Dera Ismail Khan radio stations can be heard only during day time.

1.3.3 Trade and Trade Centres

No trading centre exists in the district and most of the commodities are brought in from Punjab. Wool, leather, ropes (made of dwarf palm leaves) and onion are exported to Punjab.

1.4 HISTORY, ETHNICITY/TRIBES AND CULTURE

1.4.1 History

A specific mention of Musakhel is hard to come by in the historical descriptions. However, study of the history of Kandahar and northern Balochistan provides scattered references to the area. Musakhel has remained a part of Kandahar province from 1383 to 1884. According to the early history, this area, being a part of Kandahar province, was ruled by the Ghaznavids, Maliks of Kurat dynasty, Amir Taimur and his successors (1383-1470 AD). Sultan Hussain Mirza of Herat (1470-1480 AD), and Amir Shuja-ud-Din Zunnun (1480-1504). In 1505 AD, the Mughals conquered the province of Kandahar and held it till 1559 AD when the Safavid kings of Persia acquired it. The Mughals regained the province in 1595 AD but lost it again in 1622 AD, to the Safavid kings of Persia. In 1709 AD, the Afghan inhabitants rose under Mir Wais Ghilzai and established the Ghilzai power in Kandahar. The Ghilzai power was terminated by Nadir Shah in 1737 AD. After the assassination of Nadir Shah in 1747 AD, the first democratic government was established in Kandahar by the Afghans as they elected Ahmed Shah Durrani as their ruler. In 1826, the first Amir of Afghanistan, Dost Muhammad Barakzai, took hold of the area and annexed it to Afghanistan.

After the first phase of the Afghan war of 1878-79 AD, the British took control of the northern areas of Balochistan under the treaty of Gandamak. During 1879-84 AD, efforts were made to extend the British influence over the Khetrans and Musakhels of the, now Musakhel territory. The people of Musakhel took part in outrages committed by the Kakars under Shah Jahan in 1884, but surrendered to the British government on the conclusion of the expedition in the same year. On 1st November 1887, the whole area was declared part of British India. Zhob agency was formed in 1890 and Musakhel territory was annexed to it. Later Musakhel was made a tehsil in 1892 and was transferred to Loralai district in October 1903.

Musakhel remained a tehsil of Loralai district till 1st January 1992 when it was notified as a district as a result of splitting Loralai district into 3 districts, Loralai, Musakhel, and Barkhan.

1.4.2 Ethnicity and Tribes

The major tribes of Musakhel are Musakhels the principal division of which are Belkhels and Laherzais, Jafar (Afghan), Isot (Afghan), Zimri (Afghan), Syed, Qaisrani (Baloch) and Buzdar (Baloch). The languages spoken are Pashto, Jafarki and Balochi.

1.4.3 Food

Majority of the people take two meals daily, one in the morning and other at sunset. Men and women generally eat separately. Only well-to-do families have a third meal (breakfast) early in the morning. Male members of the family are given preferance over females in respect of food. Meal is made up of wheat and maize bread, milk, butter-milk (Lassi), Eating of Landi (a kind of biltong) is common during the winter. Sheep are specially fattened for the purpose, and are killed about the end of November. Fish are also found in Rode and Toi streams but the local people abstain from eating it. Use of vegetables is also rare.

1.4.4 Dress and Ornaments

The common dress of the people is *Shalwar* and *Qamiz*. The Musakhels, Isots and Zimris wear black and dark turbans, while the Jafars (only the oldmen) and the Balochs wear the white turbans. The women wear a wrapper and a long shirt reaching to the knee. The clothing standard is now getting improved.

1.4.5 Dwellings

Majority of inhabitants still retain their nomadic style and live in temporary settlements. Most of the people live in single room houses and huts with a boundary wall of stones or just wild shrubs. Separate bathroom, latrines and kitchen facilities are rare.

1.4.6 Occupations

The principal occupation is agriculture combined with flock owning. Now the people are getting jobs/services in government departments and the Army, particularly the Jafars who are more educated than the other tribes of the district.

1.4.7 Culture, Customs and Traditions

Musakhel is a kinship based society where the tribal system prevails. Once the Sardars had great influence over the people but with the passage of time this influence has decreased. However, the Sardar's family still enjoys a superior status because of their economic prosperity. The Musakhels, Jafars, Isots and Zimris draw their normative structure from the Pushtoon culture. The Jafars of Drug area have a distinct culture which has traces of the Baloch culture of people in Dera Ghazi Khan. The Jafar dance (specially the dance with sword) is very interesting. Their talent and interest in education is commendable and they demonstrate a civilized society.

The tradition of *Vulvar* (bride-price), rivalries which transcend generations, hospitality and keeping of fire arms are still prevalent in Musakhel. Musakhel is a male dominated society where male children are preferred. This preference results in discrimination against female children in education, health, nutrition and other aspects of life. The birth of a male child is announced by gunshots. The custom of *Haal* (latest intelligence) which the Balochs are bound to communicate to others) is common amongst the Balochs, when they met each other. The immediate neighbours of the Balochs the Isots, Jafars, Zimris and Laherzais also follow this custom to some extent.

The whole population of the district belongs to the sunni sect of Islam. Generally the people practice Islam according to its fundamental principles. But the daughters are not given their property rights according to the principles of Islam. All Islamic festivals are celebrated with religious zeal and fervour.

The tradition of *Vulvar* is common. Many youngsters have to wait for years before they can afford to pay *Vulvar*. In rare cases the bride is given some dowry from her parents. Endogamy is a common practice. Sometimes marriages are arranged to mediate a rivalry in which girl from the aggressor's family, is given in marriage to a member of the victims family. Elopement is a taboo and both the girl and the boy are murdered if found by the relatives. Neither the groom nor the bride is allowed to choose his/her life partner. The decision is made by the parents or guardians. All the expenses for entertainment of the wedding guests are paid for by the grooms family.

1.5 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

1.5.1 Executive, Judiciary and Revenue System

The district is under the charge of Deputy Commissioner, who is assisted by an Assistant Commissioner, a Tehsildar and two Naib-Tehsildars one each at Musakhel and Kingri. The district has one sub-division (Musakhel) which is further divided into one tehsil (Musakhel) and one sub-tehsil (Kingri).

Deputy Commissioner is also the overall coordinator of various government, departments and also collects revenue on behalf of government.

The district is divided into two areas as far as law enforcement is concerned. Area "A" is controlled by the Balochistan Police headed by a Deputy Superintendent of Police stationed at Loralai. "B" area is controlled by the Balochistan Levies Force headed by the Deputy Commissioner in Musakhel. There are ten levies thanas at Musakhel (HQ), Toisar, Drug, Zimri Plasin, Tangisar, Sarkandi, Kot Khan Muhammad, Khajuri, Kingri and Rarasham. The total strength of levies force in the district is 210.

There is only one police station in Musakhel town and rest of the district is controlled by levies force. The Deputy Commissioner controls the levies through his Assistant Commissioner, Tehsildar and Naib-Tehsildars. In addition, a company of Loralai scouts is deputed at Musakhel.

Musakhel has been characterized by violence, murders and tribal feuds but since it has been declared a district and the office of Deputy Commissioner has been established, the law and order situation has improved to some extent.

On the judicial side, only one Qazi court is operating at Musakhel. The district falls under the jurisdiction of Session Division, Loralai. Appeal against decisions of Qazi courts can be made before a *Majilis-e-Shoora* which comprises of two Qazis under the chairmanship of District and Session Judge. Both types of courts work in complete harmony.

Another old justice delivery mechanism used to be the *jirga* system which has officially been abolished. The *jirga* was headed by a nominee of the Deputy Commissioner. The Deputy Commissioner and afterwards the Commissioner was the appellate authority. This system was both effective and economical.

Revenue is collected through various agencies. The local councils were responsible for collection of octroi and other revenue until recently. Some utility fees are collected by the provincial government like water charges and livestock cess. Income tax is levied by the federal government.

1.6 HEALTH

The break-up of the health services available in the district is given in the following table 1.5:-



Only primary level health facilities are available in the district. Medical Professionals are not available in the district. In case of serious disease, the patients are shifted to Loralai or Dera Ghazi Khan/Multan and due to rough *kacha* roads, most of the patients are put at great risk during transportation.

The District Health Officer is responsible for primary health care and related facilities. The only hospital in the district is not functional as yet.

Educationally the district is backward with the exception of Drug area, where the literacy rate is about 60 percent. There is one degree college for boy and one inter college for girls at Musakhel one inter college for boys is at Drug.


The school administration in the district is the responsibility of District Education Officer and Sub-divisional Education Officer.

1.8 IMPORTANT / HISTORICAL PLACES


There is no historical/archaeological site worth seeing at Musakhel. However, the district is endowed with natural beauty. It is one of the most beautiful parts of Balochistan, but infrastructure for development of tourism is absolutely non-existent.

1.8.1 Drug Town

Drug is a populous, civilized and flourishing town of the district. Drug-Taunsa road is the shortest link to Punjab. Many inhabitants of Drug area are posted and serving on higher posts due to their education and talent.

2. BROAD ANALYSIS OF POPULATIN CENSUS DATA

2.1 POPULATION SIZE, GROWTH AND DISTRIBUTION

2.1.1 Population Size and Growth

The population of Musakhel district is 134.06 thousands in 1998 as compared to 91.17 thousands in 1981 recording an increase of 47.04 percent over the last 17 years i.e. 1981-98. The increase of 136.50 and 58.51 percents was observed during intercensal period 1972-81 (8.46 years) and 1961-72 (11.67 years) respectively. Overall the population of the district has increased quite rapidly showing substantial increase of 451.23 percent during the last 37 years i.e. 1961-98 which is five and half times.

The average annual growth rate of population in the district has declined to 2.29 percent during intercensal period 1981-98 as against 10.71 percent during 1972-81 and 4.03 percent in 1961-72. If the population of the district keep up growing at an average annual growth rate of 2.29 percent it will double in about 30 years. Table 2.1 gives population and intercensal increase of the district since 1961. Figures 2.1 and 2.2 depict population increase and its growth rate since 1961 in a graphic presentation.

The total area of the district is 5728 square kilometers having population density of 23.4 persons per square kilometer in March, 1998.

2.1.2 Household Size


The average household size for the district is 7.0 persons in 1998. The household size varies at 7.0 and 7.4 between rural and urban areas respectively. The average annual growth rate of the district is slightly less than the national growth rate of 2.61 percent during the corresponding period.

2.1.3 Rural/Urban Distribution

The rural population of the district is 122.47 thousands constituting 91.35 percent of the total population. The average annual growth rate of rural population during 1981-98 is 1.75 percent which was 11.03 and 3.97 percents during 1972-81 and 1961-72 respectively. The urban population of the district is 11.59 thousands constituting 8.65 percent of the total population. Figure 2.3 illustrates rural/urban distribution of population of the district in 1998 in graphic presentation.

POPULALTION 1961 TO 1998 CENSUSES




Intercensal Average Annual Growth Rate

2.1.4 Religion

The population of the district is almost Muslim. They constitute 99.55 percent of the total population, with a breakup of 99.53 percent in rural and 99.72 percent in urban areas. There are very few Christian, Hindu, Qadiani/Ahmadi, Scheduled Caste and other communities which are 0.44 percent of the total population. Table 2.2 gives percentage distribution of population by religion with rural/urban residence in 1998.

2.1.5 Mother Tongue

The mother tongue refers to the language used for communication between parents and their children in the household. The question was asked about all individuals living in the housing unit.

The predominant mother tongue of the population of the district is Pashto which is spoken by 78.92 percent of the total population followed by Balochi at 13.59 percent. The proportion of the population speaking Pashto is relatively higher in urban areas at 95.34 percent as compared to 77.36 percent in rural areas while that of Balochi this ratio is higher in rural areas at 14.58 percent in comparison to that in urban areas at 3.10 percent. The proportion of the population speaking Urdu, Punjabi, Sindhi, Saraiki and other languages is 7.49 percent. Table 2.3 gives break up of the languages spoken with rural/urban population.

2.2 SEX, AGE AND MARITAL STATUS

2.2.1 Sex Ratio

Sex ratio is an important demographic indicator which is defined as the "number of males per hundred females". The sex ratio of the district computed in 1998 is 123.7 for the district. The sex ratio in rural and urban areas of the district is 123.95 and 121.50 respectively which indicates that the male proportion is higher in the rural areas as compared to the urban areas.

2.2.2 Age Structure

According to 1998 Census the population below 15 years is 51.40 percent of the total population. Out of this 16.25 percent is below 5 years age including 1.61 percent infants. The population of 65 years and above is 3.10 percent and 45.51 percent of the population is of the working age group (15-64 years), giving an age dependency ratio of 119.75 percent in 1998. This ratio for rural and urban areas is 119.26 and 125.07 percent respectively.

The adult population 18 years of age and above in the district is 43.31 percent. This percentage in rural and urban areas is 43.39 and 42.56 percent respectively. The percentage of population eligible to vote i.e 21 years of age and above is 37.05 percent which is slightly higher in rural areas at 37.09 percent in comparison to 36.64 percent in urban areas. The population by important age groups is given in table 2.4. Figure 2.4 shows an age and sex structure of the population of the district in a graphic presentation.



The population age and sex pyramid of the district shows an unusual picture specially in the younger age groups i.e. under 5 years, 12.41 percent males and 21.01 percent females, 10-14 years 18.74 percent males and 10.09 percent females and 15-19 years 11.72

percent males and 5.88 percent females may be due to age misreporting under/over statement of ages of either sex by respondent during enumeration in recording the ages. The sex ratios at various ages are therefore, typical in nature and hardly explainable with out going in to deeper analysis. The shape of the pyramid is becoming narrower at advanced age groups by virtue of declining age factors.

2.2.3 Marital Status

All individuals aged 15 years and above have been enumerated according to their marital status namely married, never married, widowed and divorced. Out of them 25.17 percent are never married, 71.66 percent married, 3.11 percent widowed and 0.06 percent are divorced. The percentage of the never married amongst male is relatively higher at 36.46 percent as compared to 11.39 percent among female. This difference is also reflected through the mean age at marriage which is also higher for males at 24.79 years as compared to female at 18.42 years.

2.2.4 Female of Reproductive Ages by Marital Status

Out of total female population, 39.21 percent is in child bearing ages i.e 15 to 49 years, the percentage is a little higher in urban areas at 40.33 percent as against 39.10 percent in rural areas. Among the female in reproductive ages 12.71 percent are never married, 86.09 percent are currently married, 1.17 percent widowed and 0.04 percent divorced. Twelve point twenty seven percent married women of child bearing age are found without any child, 8.94 percent have reported one child, 40.75 percent have 2 to 4 children, 10.11 percent have 5 children and 27.93 percent have 6 and more children.

2.2.5 Disabled Persons

The disabled persons constitute 4.42 percent of the total population of the district, among them 4.46 percent are male and 4.38 percent female. Among the disabled, percentage of crippled is 19.26 percent for both sexes which is 15.49 percent for male and 24.00 percent for female. The percentage of having more than one disability is 12.50 percent for both sexes,11.47 percent for male and 13.79 percent for female. The blind among the disabled is 9.49 percent, 10.05 percent for male and 8.80 percent for female.

Fifty eight point seventy five percent of the disabled population were reported having disability others also including, insane, mentally retarded and deaf and mute.

2.3 LITERACY AND EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

2.3.1 Literacy

A person was treated as literate in 1998 Census if he could read a newspaper and write a simple letter in any language. The literacy ratio of the district among the population aged 10 years and above is 10.37 percent, 16.05 percent is urban areas and 9.86 percent in rural areas. The male literacy ratio is 14.34 percent compared to 4.80 percent for female.

Table 2.5 gives literacy ratio by sex and rural/urban for 1998 Census which is also highlighted by figure 2.5 in a graphic presentation.

2.3.2 Educational Attainment

A person aged 10 year and above, is treated as an educated if he attains any educational level. The percentage of educated persons like literacy ratio is 9.42 percent of the population aged 10 years and above. A large variation exists in the ratio of educated persons by sex and area. The percentage of educated males is 13.38 percent and of females, 3.84 percent. It is 15.92 percent for urban areas as against 8.83 for rural areas. Table 2.6 shows the educated persons by sex and urban rural areas.

2.3.3 Enrolment Ratio

The enrolment ratio measure the percenatge of students to population of ages 5-24 years which is 11.66 percent of the district. It is higher for males i.e 13.16 percent as compared to 9.14 percent for females. The enrolment ratio is significently higher in urban areas at 47.54 percent as against 8.49 in rural areas. A significant difference appears between male and female enrolment ratio both in rural and urban areas. The ratio of male enrolment is 1.26 times to that of females in rural areas while the difference is about two times in urban areas. Table 2.7 gives enrolment ratio by sex rural/urban areas in 1998.

LITERACY RATIO - 1998



2.3.4 Level of Education

Out of the total educated persons, 26.46 percent have passed primary, 19.67 percent middle and 23.70 percent matriculation. After matriculation the percentage falls to 6.90 percent for intermediates, 4.03 percent for graduates and 1.80 percent for post graduates. In addition, 0.56 percent are diploma/certificate holder and 1.36 percent are all others. The percentage of dropout before attaining the primary level is 15.52.

2.4 MIGRATION

2.4.1 Migration

Mirgration data covers movement of population from one district to another in the same province and from one province to another. It does not cover person who changed their place of residence within their own district in view of the limitation of the questionnaire.

2.4.2 Life Time Migrants

The total life time in-migrants are only 0.24 percent of the total population. Out of which the male and female life time in-migrants are the same i.e. 0.24 percent. The persons who have migrated into the district during the last one year after March 1997 are 49.69 percent. About forty six and half percent have migrated during last 5 years after March, 1993, while 3.77 percent had migrated before 5 years after 1988. No one has been reported to be migrated 10 years earlier.

The majority of life time in-migrants 43.40 percent, migrated due to other reasons, followed by 30.82 percent, employment transfer, 22.96 percent moved with head of households and 2.83 percent due to business.

Majority of in-migrants i.e. 43.40 percent belong to the Balochistan while 42.14 percent migrated from other provinces. No one has been reported to be repatriated to home from other countries and migrated from Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Northern Areas while 14.47 percent had not reported their place of previous residence. Table 2.8 provides the percentage of life time in-migrants of the district.

2.5 ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

2.5.1 Economically Active Population

The economically active population of the Musakhel district among the population aged 10 years and above to the total population is 26.86 percent which is 36.01 thousand souls with 98.78 percent male and 1.21 percent female. The remaining 73.14 percent economically inactive population consists of 36.53 percent children below 10 years, 26.36 percent domestic workers including 57.32 percent female amongst the total females and 1.33 percent male workers amongst total males. The students share is 3.86 percent while all other categories constitute 6.40 percent in the total economically inactive population of the district.

The labour force participation rate as percentage of total labour force to the population aged 10 years and above is computed at 42.36 percent for the district. There is a significant difference in the participation rates between male and female labour force as 71.56 percent for male compared to 1.23 percent for female. The labour force participation rate is higher i.e. 43.66 percent in rural area as compared to 27.40 percent in the urban area. Table 2.9 gives the percentage distribution of population by economic categories.

2.5.2 Un-Employment

The un-employment rate (55.60 percent) as percentage of un-employeed labour force (i.e looking for work and laid off) to the total labour force reflects a high degree of un-employment in the district which is much higher for male i.e 55.92 percent compared to female of 29.59 percent. The un-employment rate in the rural areas is relatively higher at 55.79 percent as compared to 52.26 percent in urban areas.

2.5.3 Employed Population by Occupation

Among the employed class in the district the highest percentage 62.22 belongs to Major Occupation Group-6 "skilled agricultural and fishery workers", followed by Group-9 "elementary occupations" and Group-5 "service workers and shop and market sales workers" comprising 21.97 and 8.00 percent respectively. The next higher is Group-2 "professionals" sharing 3.01 percent. The rest 4.81 percent of the employed population are engaged in the remaining occupational groups.

2.5.4 Employed Population by Industry

Most of the working population i.e 57.68 percent is engaged in the Major Industrial Division-1 "agriculture, forestry, hunting and fishing". Out of the remaining 42.32

percent, 20.55 percent are engaged in Division-9 "community, social and personal services" followed by 8.16 percent engaged in Major Division-5 "construction", 6.66 percent associated with Major Division-4 "electricity, gas and water" and 5.82 percent in Major Division-6 "wholesale and retail trade and restaurants and hotels". The next higher is Major Division-7 "transport, storage and communication" sharing 0.62 percent. The rest 0.51 percent engaged in the remaining industrial divisions.

2.5.5 Employed Population by Employment Status

The proportion of working or employed population (working and un-paid family helper) to population 10 years of age and above is 18.79 percent. Out of this 66.71 percent are self employed,21.55 percent working as employees(Govt.Autonomous and Private) and 9.88 percent are un-paid family helper. The employer category is only 1.85 percent. If we compare rural/urban variations, the proportion of self employed is higher in rural areas while that of employee(Govt) is higher in urban areas. The percentage of un-paid family helpers is higher in rural areas. Table 2.10 gives percantage of working population by employment status.

2.6 IMMUNIZATION

The question about immunization has been included in the 1998 Population Census for the first time to evaluate the vaccination programme launched by the Government from time to time. About 34 percent of the children under 10 years age have reported as vaccinated, while 28.42 percent reported as not vaccinated leaving the rest i.e 37.44 reported as not known. The percentage of vaccinated female is slightly higher at 17.18 percent as against vaccinated males at 16.96 percent. Table 2.11 gives detail of immunization by sex and rural/urban area.

2.7 NATIONAL IDENTITY CARD

The question about National Identity Card was asked in the 1998 Population Census for the first time to see the coverage element of National Identity Card. The question about National Identity Card was asked from population of 18 years age and above. According to the responses to the question it was found that 37.23 percent of the population aged 18 years and above have obtained National Identity Card. It was 46.29 percent for male and 27.36 percent for female. Table 2.12 gives the necessary detail by sex and area.

3. BROAD ANALYSIS OF HOUSING CENSUS DATA

3.1 TYPE OF HOUSING STOCK

3.1.1 Level of Congestion, Persons and Rooms

About thirty five percent of the housing units in the Musakhel district are single room houses. The percentage of single room houses is relatively higher at 35.71 in rural areas in comparison to that in urban areas at 23.92 percent. The percentage of housing units with 2 to 4 rooms is higher in urban areas at 67.74 percent as against 52.16 percent in rural areas. The percentage of houses with 5 or more rooms is higher in rural areas as compared to that in urban areas.

The number of rooms per housing unit is slightly higher in urban areas at 2.96 as against 2.80 in rural areas. The level of congestion (persons per room) is the same both in rural and urban areas i.e. 2.5. The level of congestion in terms of persons per housing unit is slightly higher in urban areas at 7.4 in contrast to 7.0 in rural areas requiring construction of more housing units with additional rooms to reduce the level of congestion. Table 3.1 gives the indices of congestion in 1998 Census.

3.1.2 Nature of Tenure

There were 19104 housing units in the Musakhel district in 1998 Census, 17582 (92.03 percent) in rural areas and 1522 (7.97 percent) in urban areas. As classified by tenure, 95.95 percent of the total housing units were owned. The percentage of ownership in rural areas is relatively higher at 96.26 as against 92.44 in urban areas. The percentage of rented housing units in urban areas is fairly higher than that in rural areas. Similarly percentage of rent free houses in urban areas is also higher at 4.73 percent as compared to the rural areas at 2.83 percent. Table 3.2 provides the data by nature of tenure.

3.1.3 Period of Construction

Of the total owned housing units (6530) in the district, 78.32 percent, were built more then 10 years earlier, 14.22 percent during the last 5-10 years, 7.15 percent during the last five years and only 0.32 percent houses were found under construction. The percentage of houses constructed in urban areas before 10 years is higher at 80.67 as compared to that in rural areas at 78.13 percent. Similarly the percentage of houses constructed during last 5-10 years is higher in urban areas at 17.20 as against 13.97 in rural areas.

3.1.4 Construction Material-Outer Walls

The district has 39.07 percent housing units having outer walls made of unbaked bricks with earth bonding and 37.82 percent of the houses have the standard pacca walls made of bricks/blocks and stones with cement bonding. There is marked variation in the qualitative indices of construction between urban and rural areas. In urban areas 9.59 percent of the housing units have the standard pacca walls made of baked bricks/blocks and stones with cement bonding, 70.83 percent have walls of un-baked bricks with earth bonding and 1.45 percent have wooden walls while other categories are 18.13 percent. In contrast, the rural areas have 40.27 percent of the walls in the standard category of baked bricks/blocks and stone with cement bonding and 36.32 percent of walls are made of un-baked bricks with mud/earth bonding. The wooden category is 8.14 percent and the un-specified category of material used is 15.27 percent. Table 3.3 gives detail of construction material used in outer walls.

3.1.5 Construction Material-Roofs

The predominant material used for construction of roof in the district is wooden log/bamboo by 79.62 percent housing units while 17.88 percent of housing units have their roof built with un-specified material.

The standard of construction of roofs significantly differs in rural and urban areas. Seventy eight point fifty three percent of the housing units in rural and 92.12 percent in urban areas have used baked bricks supported by girder or wooden log/bamboo in the construction of roofs. In contrast the use of un-specified material in the construction of roofs is higher at 18.96 percent in rural areas as compared to 5.32 percent in urban areas.

In rural areas 0.45 percent houses have used RCC/RBC in the construction of roofs. The use of this category in urban areas is 0.39 percent. The use of cement/iron sheets is 2.17 percent in urban areas as against 2.05 percent in rural areas. Table 3.4 gives detail of material used in roofs by rural/urban areas.

3.2 HOUSING FACILITIES

3.2.1 Source of Drinking Water

The easy access to potable/safe drinking water is one of the basic human needs. As per information gathered in 1998 Housing Census, the facility of drinking water inside the house is available to 15.54 percent of the housing units, while 84.46 percent of the housing units use outside source as drinking water. The facility inside the house is significantly higher in the urban area as compared to the rural areas, where the majority of the households are depending on the source of drinking water outside the house. Table 3.5 gives detail of the source of drinking water by rural/urban areas.

3.2.2 Source of Lighting

The main source of lighting is kerosene oil which is used by 82.85 percent of the housing units. This percentage in urban areas is r elatively higher at 92.38 percent in comparison to that in rural areas at 82.02 percent. The other sources of lighting is used by 13.85 percent of the household in the district. This percentage is relatlively higher in rural areas at 14.51 percent as against urban areas at 6.18 percent. Electricity is used by only 3.31 percent of the housing units. This percentage is higher in rural areas at 3.47 percent as against urban areas at 1.45 percent. Table 3.6 provide percentage of housing units by source of lighting by rural/urban area.

3.2.3 Cooking Fuel Used

About ninety two percent of the housing units in the district use wood for cooking, 4.23 percent housing units use kerosene oil, 3.43 percent use other sources and 0.47 percent are gas users. The wood is more prevalent in urban areas where 98.16 percent housing units use it followed by 1.31 percent kerosene oil, 0.33 percent other sources and 0.20 percent gas users. These percentages in rural areas are 91.32 for wood, 4.48 percent kerocene oil, 3.70 percent other sources and 0.49 percent are gas users. Table 3.7 provide percentage of housing units by source of cooking fuel used by rural/urban areas.

3.2.4 Availability of Separate Kitchen, Bathroom and Latrine Facilities

Three point ninty three percent of the housing units in the district had a separate kitchen, 4.61 percent had separate bathroom and 3.59 percent had independent latrine. The figure for urban areas for separate kitchen, separate bathroom and separate latrine are 5.19, 10.58 and 6.18 percents respectively which are higher as compared to rural areas. Similarly the percentage of shared facilities for kitchen, bathroom and latrine are also higher in urban areas at 68.73, 62.29 and 41.00 percents respectively in comparison to that in rural areas. Table 3.8 gives detail of availability of housing facilities by rural/urban areas.

3.2.5 Source of Information

The question about source of information has been asked for the first time in the 1998 Population Census to assess the media coverage. About two percent of the households in rural areas have access to television, 13.55 percent radio and 1.36 percent newspaper as source of information. The percentage figures of media reach for urban areas especially for radio and newspaper are relatively higher i.e. 31.27 percent and 7.88 percent respectively. Table 3.9 provide percentage of housing units by source of information by rural/urban areas.



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DEFINITIONS AND CONCEPTS

Urban Areas

All localities which were either metropolitan corporation, municipal corporation, municipal committee, town committee or cantonment at the time of the census, were treated as urban.

Household

A household means a group of persons living together who have collective arrangement for eating. A person living alone was also considered to constitute a household. The distinguishing characteristic of a household is its common cooking arrangement.

Housing Unit

A housing unit means a separate and independent place of abode, inhabited by one household and, if vacant, meant for habitation by one household. It does not necessarily mean a separate building. A building may have one or more housing units. Furthermore, any place not intended for habitation but occupied by a household at the time of census was also treated as a housing unit.

Room

A room is defined as a space in a housing unit having a roof and walls from roof to floor. This includes sleeping, dining, drawing, study, children's and servant's rooms but excludes kitchen, bathroom, latrine, store, balcony, porch and motor garage.

Age

Age is recorded as of the last birthday.

Marital Status

Marital status has been classified into never-married, married, widowed and divorced. Never-married applies to persons who have never been married. Married includes all persons who are at present married and living as husband and wife as well as those married persons living apart but having a living wife/husband. Those couples, whose marriage (Nikah) had been solemnized but giving away ceremony had not taken place, were also treated as married. Widowed applies to a person whose husband or wife was dead but who had not married again. Divorced applies to both divorcer and divorcee, if not remarried.

Religion

Religion is recorded and tabulated as informed by the respondents.

Literate

A person who can read a newspaper and write a simple letter, in any language, is treated as literate.

Field of Education

(a) General Education

It includes educational programmes of primary, middle, matriculation, intermediate and bachelor's degree in arts or science.

(b) Technical/Engineering

It includes engineering educational programmes in the fields of electrical, electronic, industrial, metallurgical, mining, mechanical, agricultural, forestry, chemical, petrochemical, aviation, nautical, etc. It also includes programmes in survey, drafting and designing, all types of engineering technician programmes, all types of trade, craft and industrial programmes. Architectural and town planning programmes are also included.

(c) Medicine/Tib

It includes educational programmes of medical diagnostic and treatment techniques, medicine and surgery, medical X-ray techniques, dentistry, pharmacy, etc.

(d) Health

It includes educational programmes of public health, nursing, mid-wifery and other health related auxiliary programmes.

(e) Commerce/Business Administration

It includes educational programmes of typing, shorthand, clerical, secretarial, operation of office machines, book keeping, accountancy, electric data processing, business administration, marketing and sales, financial management and investment analysis, public administration, institutional administration, personal administration and other commercial, business and public administration programmes.

(f) Teaching

It includes all educational programmes which enable the teachers to teach all types of subjects to all categories of students. It includes education science programmes.

(g) Agriculture/Forestry/Animal Husbandry

It includes educational programmes of agriculture, forestry and fishing including general agriculture, animal husbandry, horticulture and gardening, crop husbandry, agricultural technology, food sciences and technology, veterinary, medicine, fishery science and technology, etc.

(h) Law

It includes educational programmes in jurisprudence, history of law, international law, labour law and maritime law and other laws.

(i) Economically Active Population

The economically active population comprises the persons aged 10 years and above of either sex who are engaged in some work for pay or profit including un-paid family helpers as well as those; not working but looking for work and laid off.

The Crude Activity Rate is measured as the percentage of economically active persons to the total population while the Refined Activity Rate is measured as the proportion of economically active persons among the population exposed to the risk of entering the economic life.

In collection of the data on economic activities "usual status" approach has been adopted as against the approach of labour force surveys, where data is usually collected on "current status" basis.

(j) Occupation

Occupation means the main job, profession, trade or kind/type of work usually performed by a person. In case of more than one occupation, the principal occupation is recorded. The principal occupation is that in which the person works most of the time.

(k) Industry

Industry means the activity of the organization, or business in which a person usually works

Employment Status

(a) Self-employed

Self-employed is a person who operates his own farm, business, or industry or practices a profession but does not employ any hired help, paid either in eash or kind.

(b) Government employee

A Government employee is a person who works in any Government/Semi-Government Organization for pay.

(c) Private employee

A Private employee is a person who works, for pay, for person/farm/shop/firm/ organization/office which is not run or managed by the Federal/Provincial/Local Government/Autonomous body.

(d) Employer

Employer means a person who operates his own farm, business or industry or practices a profession and who employees one or more persons for the purpose.

(e) Un-paid Family Helper

Un-paid family helper means a person who works, without pay or profit, on family farm, business or industry.

Migrant Population

The migrant population mean those who have moved out their residence from one administrative district to another administrative district. It excludes population who have moved within a district.

Disability

Disability refers to the physical and organic handicap of a person due to natural deformity or deficient functioning of any limb resulting from accident, disease, etc. For census purposes it refers to visible malfunctioning of any organ of the body. It includes blind, deaf and mute, crippled, mentally retarded and insane.
