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PREFACE

The Fifth Population and Housing Census, initially due in March 1991, was conducted from 2-18 March 1998 throughout the country including Federally Administered Tribal Areas. Northern Areas and Azad Kashmir. During the first three days i.e., from 2nd to 4th March houselisting was carried out wherein each house was physically numbered and registered as an inventory for conduct of the census from 5th to 18th March. The inventory served as a guideline for the supervisors besides ensuring complete coverage, during the census operation.

There were 3 separate questionnaires used for houselisting and collection of information on population and housing characteristics. Form-1 (Annex-A) was used for houselisting. Form-2 i.e., short form (Annex-B) was used for collection of information about all persons on core questions such as name, relationship with the head of the household, residential status, sex, age, marital status, nationality, religion, mother tongue, literacy, educational attainment and possession of national identity card, number of rooms, tenure, period when constructed, construction material of walls and roofs and source of drinking water-inside or outside, source of light, fuel used, type of kitchen, bathroom and toilet facilities and watching of TV and radio and reading of newspapers.

Form-2-A i.e., long form (Annex-C) was used for obtaining additional information about migration along with its reasons, field of education, economically active population, fertility, disability and inoculation of children against 6 diseases were asked on sample basis. About 8 percent single stage stratified sample was drawn with slightly more representation given to small provinces, districts and urban areas to make it a representative sample. Necessary definitions and concepts relating to the above mentioned questionnaires/forms are given at (Annex-D) for information of the readers.

The report mainly consists of three sections viz write up which carries general description of the district and some analysis of population and housing data, second section comprises tables while third section provides additional information about these sections in the form of annexures.

The write up section contains three main parts viz (i) general description about the district, (ii) broad analysis of population census data and (iii) broad analysis of housing census data. The general description covers location, boundary, area, geography, climate, rainfall, ethnicity, administrative set-up, agriculture, flora and fauna, health, industries, communication system, infra structure beside introducing the district. The broad analysis of population census data deal with population size, growth and distribution, other demographic and socio-economic characteristics.

The broad analysis of housing census data throw light on housing units/households, in terms of information on number of rooms, population density per housing unit and per room, tenure, period since constructed, construction material used on walls and roofs, source of drinking water, source of lighting, cooking fuel used in kitchen, availability of kitchen, toilet and bathroom facilities and assessment of media reach etc.

The report comprises 52 tables in all, 40 relate to population data, 12 to housing data. Of 52 tables 27 are based on complete count information while remaining on sample count information. Because of space problem the tables on occupation and industries are given in coded form. Therefore, after mentioning occupation and industries in coded form on the tables the detail occupational groups and industry divisions and district/sub-division map are appended at Annex-E, F & G respectively.

Census taking was a gigantic task which involved the whole nation in one way or the other which is commendable as a team work. The role of Provincial Governments was very vital and with out their active cooperation, the operation would not have been successful. The meritorious services rendered by the field staff in addition to their own jobs, are also appreciable. The services rendered by the staff and officers of Federal Bureau of Statistics in training and data processing was helpful. I am personally indebted to the Federal Government who inculcated in me a sense of responsibility to conduct the census in March 1998, and releasing the data as early as possible for the benefits of all users.

The Armed Forces supported the Population and Housing Census work on hundred percent basis therefore, I extend my gratitude to their officers/staff involved in this operation.

I also thank the International Agencies like UNFPA, UNDP, UNICEF for their financial assistance in acquiring equipment & machinery and technical support in the form of consultancy services, training and study visits abroad.

Finally I thank the officers and staff members of the Population Census Organization for their relentless efforts to complete the census successfully.

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PART - I GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

1 GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

1.1 GEOGRAPHY

1.1.1 Name, Location, Boundary and Area

Panjgur was declared as a separate administrative district in 1977. Prior to that it was a part of, the then, Makran district. The word Panjgur is the combination of two Baloch words "Panch" and "Gor". The meaning of "five graves". It is also said that five Aolivas (Saints) are laid to rest in this land. These saints were said to have been companions of Hazrat Umer Farooq, who had come to Makran with Arab Army. They later died and buried at Panjgur about 640 AD. The area was thus named Panchgor, which later on became Panjgur.

The district is located between 26° 10 to 27° 18 north latitudes and 63° 07 to 65° 31 east longitudes. It is bounded on the north by Kharan district, on the south-east by Awaran district, on the south by Kech district and on the west by Iran. The total area of the district is 16,891 square kilometers.

1.1.2 Physical Features/Topography

Topographically, Panjgur is a mountainous area and the direction of the mountains are from north-east to south-west. Two important mountain ranges lie in the district i.e. the Siahan range in the north which separates it from Kharan district, and the Central Makran range in the south separating it from Kech district. In between the two ranges are the Rakhshan Raghoi hills. General elevation of the district ranges between 900 to 1350 meters above sea level. The highest peak is Zangi Lak which is 1657 meters above sea level.

The central part is known as Rakhshan plain. It is a vast plain with an average elevation of 600 to 1000 meters above sea level. A characteristic feature of the area is its closed drainage system, due to which there are several salt swamps locally known as kaps. The biggest is near Parome, which is about 20 kilometers in diameter. Ordinarily these are dry but after rain the water rushing from the surrounding hills fill up these lakes/kaps. In dry season after evaporation of the water the lake-bed is covered with a thin layer of salt which contains a high percentage of sodium chloride.

1.1.3 Rivers and Streams

The main river in the district is Rakhshan which enters from north-east and flows to south-west. The only other running stream is Tank which flows along the north-eastern boundary.

1.1.4 Climate

The climate of the district is hot in summer and very cold in winter. The summer season starts in May and continues up to October. The winter season starts in November and continues till April. In winter a very cold wind, known as Gorich, blows from north-west. June is the hottest month with mean maximum and minimum temperature of about 39° C and 24° C respectively. January is the coldest with mean maximum and minimum temperature of about 17° C and 4° C respectively. The area is outside the monsoon current. The rainfall is scanty and uncertain. Most of the rainfall is in winter. Monthwise 30 years mean temperature, precipitation and relative humidity recorded at Panjgur station, is given below in table 1.1:-

1.1.5 Flora

Only a limited variety of trees are found in the district. Some of them are kahur (prosopis spicigera) and gazz (tamarix galica) or tamarisk trees. Fodder grass is plentiful and is even found in places where water is scarce. Some plants having pharmaceutical value including aishak, guldir, morpuzo, danichk (ispaghol), keraich and udesh are also found in the district. Guan, chigird and gishtar are wild plants. Pish (nannorhops ritchieana) which is used in the construction of huts in some areas of the district, occurs on a large scale.

1.1.6 Fauna

Wild life in the district include Sind ibex, (red fox) ravine deer and hare. Wolf and bear are also found.

1.2 AGRICULTURE AND RELATED SECTORS

1.2.1 Agriculture

Two cropping pattern is prevalent in Panjgur district. Rabi crops are sown in winter and harvested in late winter or during early summer while kharif crops are sown in summer and harvested in late summer or early winter. The major rabi crops of the district include wheat, barley, masoor, and various vegetables, in particular tomatoes. Kharif crops in Panjgur include jowar, rice, melon, vegetables, and pulses including mash and moong. Fodder is cultivated throughout the year. Acreage, production and yield of major crops grown in the district for the year 1997-98 is as under in table 1.2:-

1.2.2 Irrigation

Major sources of irrigation in the district are kaurjo, (a small water channel taken to fields from a pit dug in the bed of a perennial flow to obtain under surface water), tubewells, open surface wells and karezes. While the remaining *khushkaba* or *sailaba* land is dependent on rainfall.

Panjgur district is one of the few districts of Balochistan where karez (under ground water channels) are still the main source of irrigation and where one can find roses round the year. According to a rough estimate 123 krezes out of 200 are still functioning and providing the much needed water for agricultural purpose. Rains are scarce and there are no delay action dams in the area, with the result that water level in these channels is registering a constant decrease.

1.2.3 Forestry

The district has very limited forest cover and in a few areas only clusters of trees are found. However, a variety of wild plants, grasses and trees are found some of which have pharmaceutical value.

Date, grape and pomegranate are major fruits of the area. In some parts of the district apple orchards can also be seen. The "Muzawwati" date, a rare variety is produced in this area. Grapes produced in the area are also of superior quality but can not be sent out of the district because of poor state of roads and undependable. Same is the problem with dates and a large quantity goes waste due to transportation problems. Roses are another attraction of the area which are found round the year and are also sent to near by towns and cities. Acreage, production and yield of major fruits in the district for the year 1997-98 is given below in table 1.3:-

1.2.5 Livestock

Raising of livestock is wide spread in the district, people breed goats and other ruminants for income generation. Parome sub-tehsil is a predominantly livestock raising area.

At present only one veterinary hospital is functioning at Chitkan. Livestock population of Panjgur district according to Livestock Census, 1996 is as under in table 1.4:-

1.3 INDUSTRY AND TRADE

1.3.1 Industry

There are no industrial units located in Panjgur. Only small scale cottage industry utilizing locally available raw material e.g. pish plant are functioning. A power generation plant supplies erratic power to Panjgur town.

1.3.2 Communication

Panjgur, is connected with other parts of the province and the country by air and road. Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has daily flights from and to different destinations, such as Karachi, Quetta, Turbat, Gawadar and Pasni. Shingle roads connect the district to other cities/areas of the country. However, these roads get impassable during the rainy season as they pass through streams and flood channels without any bridge. The traffic is constrained to wait till the lowering of the water level. The total length of roads within the district is 1.655 kilometers out of which only 50 kilometers are metalled (black top).

Unavailability of black top roads in the district has hampered the transportation and trade activities. Due to high maintenance cost of the vehicles, transporters demand excessive fares which further affects the costs. Some areas do not even have shingle roads, hence agriculture products cannot be marketed. The district has no railways.

The district is out of the range of Pakistan Television's transmission. The television owners watch television programmes received via satellite. Radio broad casts from Turbat, Quetta and Khuzdar radio stations are heard.

The Pakistan Telecommunication Company Limited (PTCL) has provided a telephone network to many villages of Panjgur. Telegraphic and facsimile services, promoted by the Pakistan Telecommunication Company, are widely available in the district.

Postal services are adequate with one post office at Chitkan, one sub post office at Tasp, and 8 branch post offices at Washbood, Khanzangi, Gichk, Parome, Gramkan, Kohbun, Sordo and Katagari.

Electricity first came to Panjgur in 1967, when generator capable of producing 700 K.W were installed at Chitkan by Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA). With the passage of time however, these generators have gradually deteriorated with the result that power breakdowns take place with great persistence and even when it is available, the power supply is only a fraction of its optimal capacity. Non availability of spare parts is the reason cited by WAPDA for the malfunction. However the net result of all this is that electricity is only available to the residents for limited hours and that too is erratic. Work on a high tension 132 KV transmission line from Turbat to Panjgur via Hoshab involving the construction of a 132 KV grid station at Panjgur, is in progress. On completion of this project Panjgur will be connected to Pasni power station, via Turbat. Panjgur does not have access to natural gas pipeline.

1.3.3 Trade and Trade Centres

A large portion of the trade in the district is unregulated, cross-border trade with Iran. With large quantities of consumer goods flowing in from the neighbouring country because the nationally produced goods by comparison are much dearer. This trend is the natural out-come of the poor transportation facilities to and from the district.


Dates remain the major export item being exported to Karachi, Quetta, Sukkur and other parts of the country. Dates produced in Panjgur are processed in Karachi and Sukkur and afterwards exported to foreign markets. Local trade centres are Chitkan, Tasp and Khudabadan.

1.4 HISTORY, ETHNICITY/TRIBES AND CULTURE

1.4.1 History

The area has remained inhabited by since Pre-Islamic days and historical remnants of those days can still be seen in large number. Arabs, first came to this area alongwith the forces of Muhammad Bin Qasim.

The region remained under Iranian domination first under King Kaus and later under Afrasiab of Turan and thereafter under Kaikhusrau. Then there is a long list of rulers, including Lehrasp, Gushtasp, Bahman, Huma and Darab, up until the year 325 BC. An army contingent of Alexander the Great passed through Makran, then known as Gadrosia, on its way from India to Macedonia. The area was ruled by Seleukos Nikator, one of Alexander's generals, who lost it to Chandragupta in 303 BC. The tract of history of the region is then lost in darkness for centuries until the in fifth century after Christ we find the area transferred to Bahram-i-Gor (404 to 427 AD) as a part of dower of Shermah's daughter.

The first Afghan war (1838-39) directed the attention of the British to the area with a visit by Major Goldsmith in 1861. An Assistant Political Agent was appointed in Gwadar in 1863. In 1882, Mir Gajian, Sardar of Panjgur and Khan's naib, was killed by Mir Nauroz Khan Nausherwani, chief of Kharan as a result of an internal feud which continued for years. In 1903, an Assistant Political Agent was appointed to the area with his headquarters at Panjgur. He was also an ex-officio Commandant of the Makran Levy Corps. Ostensibly his appointment was made to enforce the Khan of Kalat's authority and to maintain peace on the borders. Panjgur remained under the control of the Khan of Kalat during the colonial era, however the British had influence in the affairs of the area.

After partition, Makran joined the Balochistan States Union in early 1949 along with Kalat, Lasbela and Kharan. In October 1955, Makran was given the status of a district of former West Pakistan province after its accession to Pakistan. On 1st July 1970, when "One Unit" was dissolved and Balochistan gained the status of a province, Makran became one of its 8 districts. On 1st July 1977, Makran was declared a division and was divided into three districts, namely:- Panjgur, Turbat (Kech) and Gwadar. Panjgur was notified as a district on July 1, 1977.

1.4.2 Ethnicity and Tribes

Historically the society in Panjgur was divided in three social strata, Hakims, Balochs, and Hizmatgars, locally known as Naqibs (also known as Darzadas and Golam in other areas of Makran). Hakims constituted privileged class of the society while Balochs being an intermediary class were relatively in a better position than Hizmatgars who were in the lowest socio-economic stratum of the society.

As a result of social changes social class boundaries have become hazy. Presently all the inhabitants of the area are covered by the blanket term Baloch. The main Baloch tribes in the district are Gichki, Mullazai, Kashani, Raise, Nausherwani, Muhammad Hassani and Rudini.

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1.4.3 Food

The majority of the people take their meals thrice a day. Dates washed down with water or milk are used for the breakfast and lunch. While in the evening use of rice and vegetables is common.

1.4.4 Dress

Balochi shalwar qameez (shirt and trousers) with turban constitute the dress for males, while females wear traditional Balochi shalwar, qameez and dopata with special types of embroidery.

A tremendous change in the style and construction of building as in other districts of Balochistan, has come about but still most of the houses and walls are made of kacha bricks. Nomadic population continue to live in tents.

1.4.6 Occupations

Many people of the district are serving in the Gulf region, and they contribute substantially to the economy of the region, others are in agriculture, trade and government service.

1.4.7 Culture, Customs and Traditions

Predominantly the joint family system prevails in the district. Male siblings reside under one household even after their marriage. However, some nuclear families are also there.

In Panjgur, marriage rituals significantly differ from those in other areas of Balochistan. Unlike other parts of Balochistan, labb (bride price) or haq mehr (dower) received in marriage contract is owned by the bride herself. She has complete right to spend or dispense it off. Haq mehr is more prevalent in Panjgur and the parents of the bride do not get any money from the groom's parents. Endogamy is the prevalent style of marriage specially among Gichkis. Most of the people are monogamous as a second marriage is expensive.

The marriage starts with the search of a bride by the grooms father. Mothers have very little role in the decision making about marriage of their sons or daughters. Neither the

groom nor the bride is allowed to choose his or her life partner. The decision of the parents is considered final, however sometimes the bridegroom is consulted. When the parents of the groom have selected a prospective bride for their son, they make a formal proposal to the bride's parents, who have full authority to accept or reject the proposal. If both parties agree for marriage, details of marriage, including amount of *haq mehr* and date of the wedding, are finalized. Some people arrange mangni (engagement ceremony) also. After marriage, the groom stays for three nights at the bride's home. Afterwards he takes her to his home.

The bride has full autonomy in using, spending, or selling the items received as haq mehr. Only a part of the haq mehr is actually paid at the time of marriage while for the remainder a written under-taking is given. If the husband divorces his wife, he will have to pay the full amount of haq mehr. If the wife demands divorce, she will have to abandon all her rights to haq mehr. The wife's rights to haq mehr not only gives her economic independence to a certain extent, but also raises her social status. This is the reason that the amount of haq mehr is considered a matter of social prestige for both the parties. After the death of the wife, the amount of haq mehr is divided among her children according to Muslim inheritance laws. In Panjgur, tribal identity has lost its importance and Baloch is a common identity. The vestiges of the Sardari system have been eliminated to a great extent. The tribal leaders. Sardars, Nawabs and Kahodas are still there but their role has been minimised in politics or decision making. In case of conflict, parties go to court of law instead of any tribal jirga.

People in Panjgur have very old traditions of co-operation. One of the forms of co-operation is called *bijar* or *sarrech*. This is a system of making a contribution by members of the tribe or community to arrange *labb* or *haq mehr* for marriage. Usually people contribute according to their own economic status and a reciprocal contribution is made later on by the recipients when they too contribute similar occassions. However, reciprocity of amount is not obligatory.

Another form of co-operation is the excavation of karezes and utilization of karez's water for irrigation or domestic purposes. The water obtained from the kareze is distributed on equity basis. A person amongst the share holders, locally called *sarishta*, is held responsible to take care of the kareze and arbitrate in case of any dispute on the distribution of water.

The Muslims constitute an overwhelming majority of population in Panjgur. Panjgur is a relatively peaceful area. Tribal vendettas are rare and usually do not prolong for years.

The Jirga system has been there but after the Balochistan High Court decision, it has been abolished. Now people try to mediate their conflicts at community level by involving old wise men or common friends as mediators. Otherwise they pursue the case through the court of law.

1.5 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

1.5.1 Executive, Judiciary and Revenue System

The district is under the general charge of a Dupty Commissioner who combines the functions of a District Magistrate as well as Collector. He is also responsible for the co-ordination of the functions of all nation-building-departments in the district. For administrative purposes the district is divided into one-sub-division, Panjgur. The sub-division is further divided into tehsils and sub-tehsils as under.


The Deputy Commissioner is assisted by an Assistant Commissioner at the sub-division level, by a Tehsildars at the tehsil level, and by a Naib-Tehsildar at the sub-tehsil level. Maintenance of law and order in the district is the responsibility of the district administration.

Panjgur district is divided into two areas for purposes of law enforcement. Area "A" is controlled by police while "B" area is controlled by the levies force, headed by the Deputy Commissioner of the district. Panjgur district is supervised by a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP). There is one police station at Chitkan.

The levies force controls the remaining parts. The Deputy Commissioner controls the levies through Assistant Commissioners, Tehsildars, and Naib-Tehsildars.

Justice is administered through regular as well as Qazi courts. An Additional District and Session Judge heads the judiciary. Previously the District Magistrate and the Sub-divisional Magistrates had judicial powers but recently administration and judiciary have been separated.

Qazi courts were established in 1976 under the provisions of Qanun-e-Diwan-i-Kalat and have powers of civil, family and rent courts. However, in tribal areas, they provide justice to private parties under the provisions of shariat laws. Appeal against decisions of Qazi courts can be made before a "Majilis-e-Shoora", which comprises two Qazis under the chairmanship of a District and Session Judge. Both types of courts work in complete harmony.

In Panjgur, revenue is collected through various agencies. The provincial government also collects some taxes like water charges, livestock cess, usher, motor vehicle registration fee and some utility fees. The federal government levies income tax and customs duty.

1.6 HEALTH

The district has one degree college for boys and a girls inter college and an elementary college for training of teachers.

1.8 IMPORTANT / HISTORICAL PLACES

1.8.1 Chitkan Town

Majority of the population dwells in a 10 kilometers radius of Chitkan, on the both banks of the Rakshan rivers. Chitkan is the headquarter of Panjgur district.

1.8.2 Archaeological Sites

Among objects of archaeological interest may be mentioned Kuhna Kalat, whose construction is based on the use of large red baked bricks, and which is said to have been destroyed by the Persians; the tomb of Malik Asa and others which are constructed of glazed bricks with rough figures of men and animals upon them; an ancient dam, named Band-e-Gillar and remnants of the fort of Nawab Habibullah Khan of Kharan in the village of Khudabadan. There are many old shrines including those of Shah Qalandar and Pir Umer in the district. The shrine of Shah Qalandar is made of baked tiles. Some decorative tiles have figures of human and animals engraved on them indicating a Pre-Islamic pattern of motifs.

2. BROAD ANALYSIS OF POPULATION CENSUS DATA

2.1 POPULATION SIZE, GROWTH AND DISTRIBUTION

2.1.1 Population Size and Growth

The population of Panjgur district is 234.05 thousands in 1998 as compared to 160.75 thousands in 1981 recording an increase of 45.60 percent over the last 17 years i.e. 1981-98. The increase of 182.91 and 108.67 percents was observed during intercensal period 1972-81 (8.46 years) and 1961-72 (11.67 years) respectively. Overall the population of the district has increased quite rapidly showing substantial increase of 759.53 percent during the last 37 years i.e. 1961-98 which is more than eight and a half times.

The average annual growth rate of population in the district has declined to 2.23 percent during the intercensal period 1981-98 as against unprecedented high growth rate of 13.08 percent during 1972-81 and 6.51 percent in 1961-72. If the population of the district keep up growing at an average annual growth rate of 2.23 percent it will double in the next 31 years. Table 2.1 gives population and intercensal increase of the district since 1961. Figures 2.1 and 2.2 depict population increase and its growth rate since 1961 in a graphic presentation.

The average household size for the district is 6.2 persons in 1998. The household size varies at 6.2 and 7.0 between rural and urban areas respectively.


2.1.3 Rural/Urban Distribution

POPULALTION 1961 TO 1998 CENSUSES




CENSUS YEAR

2.03 percent which was 14.83 and 6.89 percents during 1972-81 and 1961-72 respectively. The urban population of the district is 21.30 thousands constituting 9.10 percent of the total population. The average annual growth rate of urban population during 1981-98 is 4.86 percent which was -0.46 and 4.87 percents during 1972-81 and 1961-72 respectively. Figure 2.3 illustrates rural/urban distribution of population of the district in 1998 in graphic presentation.

2.1.4 Religion

The population of the district is almost Muslim. They constitute 99.31 percent of the total population with a breakup of 99.28 percent in rural and 99.63 percent in urban areas. There are very few Christian. Hindu. Qadiani/Ahmadi. Scheduled Caste and other communities which are only 0.69 percent of the total population. Table 2.2 gives percentage distribution of population by religion with rural/urban residence in 1998.

2.1.5 Mother Tongue

The mother tongue refers to the language used for communication between parents and their children in the household. The question was asked about all individuals living in the housing unit.

The predominant mother tongue of the population of the district is Balochi which is spoken by 99.56 percent of the total population followed by Punjabi at 0.17 percent. The proportion of the population speaking Balochi is slightly higher in rural areas at 99.67 percent as compared to 98.46 percent in urban areas. In contrast the proportion of Punjabi is higher in urban areas at 0.63 percent in comparison to that in rural areas at 0.12 percent. The proportion of the population speaking Urdu, Sindhi, Pushto, Saraiki and others is 0.27 percent. Table 2.3 gives break up of the languages spoken with rural/urban population.

RURAL/URBAN POPULATION, 1998



2.2 SEX, AGE AND MARITAL STATUS

2.2.1 Sex Ratio

Sex ratio is an important demographic indicator which is defined as the "number of males per hundred females". The sex ratio of the district computed in 1998 is 115.9 for the district. The sex ratio in rural and urban areas of the district is 116.73 and 108.02 respectively which indicates that the male proportion is higher in the rural areas as compared to the urban areas.

2.2.2 Age Structure

According to the 1998 Census the population below 15 years is 54.38 percent of the total population. Out of this 21.13 percent is below 5 years age including 2.99 percent infants. The population of 65 years and above is 1.83 percent and 43.79 percent of the population is of the working age group (15-64 years), giving an age dependency ratio of 128.37 percent in 1998. This ratio for rural and urban areas is 131.68 and 99.86 percent respectively.

The adult population 18 years of age and above in the district is 40.44 percent. This percentage in rural and urban areas is 39.76 and 47.31 percent respectively. The percentage of population eligible to vote i.e 21 years of age and above is 32.79 percent which is higher in urban areas at 36.46 percent in comparison to 32.43 percent in rural areas. The population by important age groups is given in table 2.4. Figure 2.4 shows an age and sex structure of the population of the district in a graphic presentation.

POPULATION PYRAMID OF PANJGUR DISTRICT, 1998



2.2.3 Marital Status

All individuals aged 15 years and above have been enumerated according to their marital status namely married, never married, widowed and divorced. Out of them 22.64 percent are never married, 75.19 percent married, 2.03 percent widowed and 0.14 percent are divorced. The percentage of the never married amongst male is relatively higher at 25.94 percent as compared to 19.18 percent among female. This difference is also reflected through the mean age at marriage which is also higher for males at 21.03 years as compared to female at 19.08 years.

2.2.4 Female of Reproductive Ages by Marital Status

Out of total female population, 41.86 percent is in child bearing ages i.e 15 to 49 years, the percentage is higher in urban areas at 45.97 percent as against 41.43 percent in rural areas. Among the female in reproductive ages 21.31 percent are never married, 77.04 percent are currently married, 1.51 percent widowed and 0.14 percent divorced. Eleven point twenty four percent married women of child bearing age are found without any child, 9.11 percent have reported one child, 47.33 percent have 2 to 4 children, 7.84 percent have 5 children and 24.47 percent have 6 and more children.

2.2.5 Disabled Persons

The disabled persons constitute 1.74 percent of the total population of the district. The percentage of male and female disabled persons is 1.91 and 1.55 percent respectively. Among the disabled, percentage of crippled is 6.15 percent for both sexes which is 7.00 percent for male and 4.95 percent for female. The percentage of blind is 3.41 percent for both sexes, 3.92 percent for male and 2.68 percent for female. The deaf and mute among the disabled is 1.62 percent. 1.79 percent for male and 1.37 percent for female.

About eighty nine percent of the disabled population were reported having disability others also including having more than one disability, insane and mentally retarded.

2.3 LITERACY AND EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

2.3.1 Literacy

A person was treated as literate in the 1998 Census if he could read a newspaper and write a simple letter in any language. The literacy ratio of the district among the population aged 10 years and above is 31.35 percent, 44.32 percent is urban areas and 29.93 percent in rural areas. The male literacy ratio is 39.35 percent compared to 22.34 percent for female. Table 2.5 gives literacy ratio by sex and rural/urban for 1998 Census which is also highlighted by figure 2.5 in a graphic presentation.

2.3.2 Educational Attainment

A person aged 10 year and above, is treated as an educated if he attains any educational level. The percentage of educated persons like literacy ratio is 30.79 percent of the population aged 10 years and above. A large variation exists in the ratio of educated persons by sex and area. The percentage of educated males is 38.82 percent and of females, 21.75 percent. It is 43.65 percent for urban areas as against 29.39 for rural areas. Table 2.6 shows the educated persons by sex and urban rural areas.

LITERACY RATIO - 1998



2.3.3 Enrolment Ratio

The enrolment ratio measure the percenatge of students to population of ages 5-24 years which is 36.80 percent of the district. It is higher for males i.e 43.04 percent as compared to 29.26 percent for females. The enrolment ratio is relatively higher in urban areas at 43.61 percent as against 36.10 in rural areas. A significant difference appears between male and female enrolment ratio in both rural and urban areas. The ratio for male enrolment is about one and a half times to that of females in rural areas while the difference is more than one and a half times in urban areas. Table 2.7 gives enrolment ratio by sex rural/ urban areas in 1998.

2.3.4 Level of Education

Out of the total educated persons, 28.44 percent have passed primary, 25.43 percent middle and 22.88 percent matriculation. After matriculation the percentage falls to 6.90 percent for intermediates, 3.13 percent for graduates and 1.27 percent for post graduates. In addition, 0.22 percent are diploma/certificate holder and 0.68 percent are all others. The percentage of dropout before attaining the primary level is 11.05.

2.4 MIGRATION

2.4.1 Migration

Mirgration data covers movement of population from one district to another in the same province and from one province to another. It does not cover person who changed their place of residence within their own district in view of the limitation of the questionnaire.

2.4.2 Life Time Migrants

The total life time in-migrants are 0.21 percent of the total population. Out of which the male and female life time in-migrants are 0.21 and 0.20 percent respectively. The persons who have migrated into the district during the last one year after March 1997 are 13.75 percent. Seventeen and a half percent have migrated during last 5 years after March, 1993, while 27.71 percent had migrated before 5 years but after 1988. Slightly more than forty one percent reported to have migrated 10 years earlier.

As far as the reason for migration is concerned majority of life time in-migrants i.e. 54.88 percent moved with the head of household followed by 26.67 percent due to business, 8.96 percent other reasons, 5.63 percent employment/transfer, 4.17 percent as a result of marriage and 0.21 percent for study.

Majority of in-migrants i.e. 78.54 percent belong to the Balochistan province while 15.42 percent have migrated from other provinces. No one reported to have migrated from Azad Jammu and Kashmir. Northern Area and repatriated to home from other countries while 6.04 percent had not reported their place of previous residence. Table 2.8 provides the percentage of life time in-migrants of the district.

2.5 ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

2.5.1 Economically Active Population

The economically active population of the Panjgur district among the population aged 10 years and above to the total population is 19.38 percent which is 45.37 thousand

souls with 99.31 percent male and 0.69 percent female. The remaining 80.62 percent economically inactive population consists of 40.79 percent children below 10 years, 27.90 percent domestic workers including 59.49 percent female amongst the total females and 0.64 percent male workers amongst total males. The students share is 7.93 percent while all other categories constitute 4.00 percent in the total economically inactive population of the district.

The labour force participation rate as percentage of total labour force to the population aged 10 years and above is computed at 32.74 percent for the district. There is a significant difference in the participation rates between male and female labour force as 61.39 percent for male compared to 0.48 percent for female. The labour force participation rate is slightly higher i.e. 32.74 percent in rural area as compared to 32.71 percent in the urban area. Table 2.9 gives the percentage distribution of population by economic categories.

2.5.2 Un-Employment

The un-employment rate (46.28 percent) as percentage of un-employped labour force (i.e looking for work and laid off) to the total labour force reflects a high degree of un-employment in the district which is much higher for male i.e 46.35 percent compared to female of 36.94 percent. The un-employment rate in the rural areas is fairly higher at 46.61 percent as compared to 43.32 percent in urban areas.

2.5.3 Employed Population by Occupation

Among the employed class in the district the highest percentage 50.05 belongs to Major Occupation Group-6 "skilled agricultural and fishery workers", followed by Group-9 "elementary occupations" and Group-5 "services workers and shop and market sales workers" comprising 39.89 and 4.68 percent respectively. The next higher is Group-8 "plant and machine operators and assemblers" sharing 1.47 percent. The rest 3.93 percent of the employed population are engaged in the remaining occupational groups.

2.5.4 Employed Population by Industry

Most of the working population i.e 53.82 percent is engaged in the Major Industrial Division-1 "agriculture, forestry, hunting and fishing". Out of the remaining, 18.50 percent are engaged in Division-5 "construction". 12.67 percent engaged in Major Division-9 "community, social and personal services", 4.60 percent associated with Major Division-0 "activities not adequately defind" and 4.00 percent in Major Division-6 "whole sale and retail trade and restaurants and hotels". The next higher is Major Division-4 "electricity, gas and water" sharing 3.85 percent. The rest 2.57 percent engaged in the remaining industrial divisions.

2.5.5 Employed Population by Employment Status

The proportion of working or employed population (working and un-paid family helper) to population 10 years of age and above is 17.59 percent. Out of this 67.90 percent are self employed, 29.51 percent working as employees(Govt.Autonomous and Private) and 2.20 percent are un-paid family helper. The employer category is only 0.39 percent. If we compare rural/urban variations, the proportion of self employed is slightly higher in rural areas while that of employee(Govt) is fairly higher in urban areas. The percentage of un-paid family helpers is higher in urban areas. Table 2.10 gives percantage of working population by employment status.

2.6 IMMUNIZATION

The question about immunization has been included in the 1998 Population Census for the first time to evaluate the vaccination programme launched by the Government from time to time. It is encouraging to note that 65.99 percent of the children under 10 years age have reported as vaccinated, while 9.11 percent reported as not vaccinated leaving the rest i.e 24.90 reported as not known. The percentage of vaccinated male is higher at 36.40 percent as against vaccinated females at 29.60 percent. Table 2.11 gives detail of immunization by sex and rural/urban area.

2.7 NATIONAL IDENTITY CARD

The question about National Identity Card was asked in the 1998 Population Census for the first time to see the coverage element of National Identity Card. The question was asked from population of 18 years age and above. According to the responses to the question it was found that 52.57 percent of the population aged 18 years and above have obtained National Identity Card. It was 58.93 percent for male and 46.11 percent for female. Table 2.12 gives the necessary detail by sex and area.

3. BROAD ANALYSIS OF HOUSING CENSUS DATA

3.1 TYPE OF HOUSING STOCK

3.1.1 Level of Congestion, Persons and Rooms

About forty percent of the housing units in the Panjgur district are single room houses. The percentage of single room houses is relatively higher at 42.30 in rural areas in comparison to that in urban areas at 12.70 percent. The percentage of housing units with 2 to 4 rooms is higher in urban areas at 77.34 percent as against 44.31 percent in rural areas. In contrast the percentage of houses with 5 or more rooms is higher in rural areas as compared to that in urban areas.

The number of rooms per housing unit is higher in urban areas at 2.9 as against 2.4 in rural areas. In contrast the level of congestion (persons per room) is higher in rural areas as compared to that in urban areas. The level of congestion in terms of persons per housing unit is higher in urban areas at 7.0 in contrast to 6.2 in rural areas requiring construction of more housing units with additional rooms to reduce the level of congestion. Table 3.1 gives the indices of congestion in 1998 Census.

3.1.2 Nature of Tenure

There were 36316 housing units in the Panjgur district in the 1998 Census, 33261 (91.59 percent) in rural areas and 3055(8.41 percent) in urban areas. As classified by tenure, 98.02 percent of the total housing units were owned. The percentage of ownership in rural areas is relatively higher at 98.61 as against 91.62 in urban areas. The percentage of rent free houses in urban areas is fairly higher at 4.32 percent as compared to the rural areas at 1.17 percent. Table 3.2 provides the data by nature of tenure.

3.1.3 Period of Construction

Of the total owned housing units (14275) in the district, 54.92 percent were built more then 10 years earlier, 28.27 percent during the last 5-10 years. 16.06 percent during the last five years and only 0.76 percent houses were found under construction. The percentage of houses constructed in urban areas before 10 years is higher at 64.13 as compared to that in urban areas at 54.13 percent whereas the percentage of houses constructed during last 5-10 years is higher in rural areas at 28.48 as against 25.72 in urban areas.

3.1.4 Construction Material-Outer Walls

The district has 71.26 percent housing units having outer walls made of unbaked bricks with earth bonding and 3.62 percent of the houses have the standard pacca walls made of bricks/blocks and stones with cement bonding. There is marked variation in the qualitative indices of construction between urban and rural areas. In urban areas 14.24 percent of the housing units have the standard pacca walls made of baked bricks/blocks and stones with cement bonding, 60.62 percent have walls of un-baked bricks with earth bonding and 23.47 percent have wooden walls while other categories are 1.67 percent. In contrast, the rural areas have 2.65 percent of the walls in the standard category of baked bricks/blocks and stone with cement bonding and 72.24 percent of walls are made of un-baked bricks with mud/earth bonding. The wooden category is 22.55 percent and the un-specified category of material used is 2.56 percent. Table 3.3 gives detail of construction material used in outer walls.

3.1.5 Construction Material-Roofs

The predominant material used for construction of roof in the district is wooden log/bamboo by 91.62 percent housing units while 5.03 percent of housing units have their roof built with un-specified material.

The standard of construction of roofs significantly differs in rural and urban areas. Ninety two point twenty four percent of the housing units in rural and 84.88 percent in urban areas have used baked bricks supported by girder or wooden log/bamboo in the construction of roofs. Similarly the use of un-specified material in the construction of roofs is higher at 5.08 percent in rural areas as compared to 4.58 percent in urban areas.

In urban areas 2.72 percent houses have used RCC/RBC in the construction of roofs. The use of this category in rural areas is only 0.55 percent. The use of cement/iron sheets is 7.82 percent in urban areas as against 2.14 percent in rural areas. Table 3.4 gives detail of material used in roofs by rural/urban areas.

3.2 HOUSING FACILITIES

3.2.1 Source of Drinking Water

The easy access to potable/safe drinking water is one of the basic human needs. As per information gathered in the 1998 Census, the facility of drinking water inside the house is available to 71.42 percent of the housing units, while 28.58 percent of the housing units use outside source as drinking water. The facility inside the house is significantly higher in the urban areas while the facility outside the house is higher in rural areas.

3.2.2 Source of Lighting

The main source of lighting is kerosene oil which is used by 88.96 percent of the housing units. This percentage in rural areas is significantly higher at 91.66 percent in comparison to that in urban areas at 59.51 percent. Electricity is used by 5.19 percent of the household in the district. This percentage is significantly higher in urban areas at 34.70 percent as against rural areas at 2.48 percent. The other source of lighting is used by 5.85 percent of the housing units. This percentage is slightly higher in rural areas at 5.86 percent as against urban areas at 5.79 percent. Table 3.6 provide percentage of housing units by source of lighting by rural/urban area.

3.2.3 Cooking Fuel Used

About eighty three percent of the housing units in the district use wood for cooking. 14.53 percent kerosene oil, 2.19 percent other sources and 0.49 percent gas users. The use of wood is more prevalent in rural areas where 84.41 percent housing units use it followed by 13.41 percent kerosene oil, 1.89 percent other sources and 0.30 percent gas users. These percentages in urban areas are 65.30 for wood, 26.68 percent kerosene oil, 5.47 percent other sources and 2.55 percent gas users. Table 3.7 provide percentage of housing units by source of cooking fuel used by rural/urban areas.

3.2.4 Availability of Separate Kitchen, Bathroom and Latrine Facilities

About twenty two percent of the housing units in the district had a separate kitchen, 28.31 percent had separate bathroom and 33.69 percent had independent latrine. The figure for urban areas for separate kitchen, separate bathroom and separate latrine are 39.57, 42.26 and 47.82 percents respectively which are higher as compared to rural areas. The percentage of shared facilities for kitchen and bathroom are higher in rural areas whereas the percentage of shared latrine is higher in urban areas. Table 3.8 gives detail of availability of housing facilities by rural/urban areas.

3.2.5 Source of Information

The question about source of information has been asked for the first time in the 1998 Population Census to assess the media coverage. Thirty two point thirty seven percent of the households in urban areas have access to television, 73.81 percent radio and 45.92 percent newspaper as source of information. These percentages in rural areas are 6.03 percent for television, 52.27 percent radio and 27.74 percent for newspaper. Table 3.9 provide percentage of housing units by source of information by rural/urban areas.

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DEFINITIONS AND CONCEPTS

Urban Areas

All localities which were either metropolitan corporation, municipal corporation, municipal committee, town committee or cantonment at the time of the census, were treated as urban.

Household

A household means a group of persons living together who have collective arrangement for eating. A person living alone was also considered to constitute a household. The distinguishing characteristic of a household is its common cooking arrangement.

Housing Unit

A housing unit means a separate and independent place of abode, inhabited by one household and, if vacant, meant for habitation by one household. It does not necessarily mean a separate building. A building may have one or more housing units. Furthermore, any place not intended for habitation but occupied by a household at the time of census was also treated as a housing unit.

Room

A room is defined as a space in a housing unit having a roof and walls from roof to floor. This includes sleeping, dining, drawing, study, children's and servant's rooms but excludes kitchen, bathroom, latrine, store, balcony, porch and motor garage.

Age

Age is recorded as of the last birthday.

Marital Status

Marital status has been classified into never-married, married, widowed and divorced. Never-married applies to persons who have never been married. Married includes all persons who are at present married and living as husband and wife as well as those married persons living apart but having a living wife/husband. Those couples, whose marriage (Nikah) had been solemnized but giving away ceremony had not taken place, were also treated as married. Widowed applies to a person whose husband or wife was dead but who had not married again. Divorced applies to both divorcer and divorcee, if not remarried.

Religion

Religion is recorded and tabulated as informed by the respondents.

Literate

A person who can read a newspaper and write a simple letter, in any language, is treated as literate.

Field of Education

(a) General Education

It includes educational programmes of primary, middle, matriculation, intermediate and bachelor's degree in arts or science.

(b) Technical/Engineering

It includes engineering educational programmes in the fields of electrical, electronic, industrial, metallurgical, mining, mechanical, agricultural, forestry, chemical, petrochemical, aviation, nautical, etc. It also includes programmes in survey, drafting and designing, all types of engineering technician programmes, all types of trade, craft and industrial programmes. Architectural and town planning programmes are also included.

(c) Medicine/Tib

It includes educational programmes of medical diagnostic and treatment techniques, medicine and surgery, medical X-ray techniques, dentistry, pharmacy, etc.

(d) Health

It includes educational programmes of public health, nursing, mid-wifery and other health related auxiliary programmes.

(e) Commerce/Business Administration

It includes educational programmes of typing, shorthand, clerical, secretarial, operation of office machines, book keeping, accountancy, electric data processing, business administration, marketing and sales, financial management and investment analysis, public administration, institutional administration, personal administration and other commercial, business and public administration programmes.

(f) Teaching

It includes all educational programmes which enable the teachers to teach all types of subjects to all categories of students. It includes education science programmes.

(g) Agriculture/Forestry/Animal Husbandry

It includes educational programmes of agriculture, forestry and fishing including general agriculture, animal husbandry, horticulture and gardening, erop husbandry, agricultural technology, food sciences and technology, veterinary, medicine, fishery science and technology, etc.

(h) Law

It includes educational programmes in jurisprudence, history of law, international law, labour law and maritime law and other laws.

(i) Economically Active Population

The economically active population comprises the persons aged 10 years and above of either sex who are engaged in some work for pay or profit including un-paid family helpers as well as those; not working but looking for work and laid off.

The Crude Activity Rate is measured as the percentage of economically active persons to the total population while the Refined Activity Rate is measured as the proportion of economically active persons among the population exposed to the risk of entering the economic life.

In collection of the data on economic activities "usual status" approach has been adopted as against the approach of labour force surveys, where data is usually collected on "current status" basis.

(j) Occupation

Occupation means the main job, profession, trade or kind/type of work usually performed by a person. In case of more than one occupation, the principal occupation is recorded. The principal occupation is that in which the person works most of the time.

(k) Industry

Industry means the activity of the organization, or business in which a person usually works.

Employment Status

(a) Self-employed

Self-employed is a person who operates his own farm, business, or industry or practices a profession but does not employ any hired help, paid either in each or kind.

(b) Government employee

A Government employee is a person who works in any Government/Semi-Government Organization for pay.

(c) Private employee

A Private employee is a person who works, for pay, for person/farm/shop/firm/ organization/office which is not run or managed by the Federal/Provincial/Local Government/Autonomous body.

(d) Employer

Employer means a person who operates his own farm, business or industry or practices a profession and who employees one or more persons for the purpose.

(e) Un-paid Family Helper

Un-paid family helper means a person who works, without pay or profit, on family farm, business or industry.

Migrant Population

The migrant population mean those who have moved out their residence from one administrative district to another administrative district. It excludes population who have moved within a district.

Disability

Disability refers to the physical and organic handicap of a person due to natural deformity or deficient functioning of any limb resulting from accident, disease, etc. For census purposes it refers to visible malfunctioning of any organ of the body. It includes blind, deaf and mute, crippled, mentally retarded and insane.
